# St Andrew's School

These were year group based and well attended with positive feedback.

Key Stage 2 extended their knowledge about English cultural heritage by learning about London. This included an exciting educational visit to London on the train. There was buzz amongst the children as they embarked on this adventure. The first hand experience really enhanced their written work as they could write about their own observations and emotions.

Harvest Festival was also well attended by parents. The service took part in the St. Nicholas Church, the South Lopham catchment area of the school. The service included poems, songs and prayers. The generous gifts that were donated were sent to the Norwich Shelter for homeless.

At the beginning of October, St. Andrew's pupils enjoyed a feast of reading activities to celebrate book week. These included visiting the Scholastic book fair, parents coming in to read to children, paired reading and returning to school in the evening in pyjamas for a bedtime read and hot chocolate.

The netball and football teams have also been very active, representing the school in the Small School League.

St. Andrew's now look forward to the forthcoming month of events, which include Anti-Bullying Week, a visit from the Bishop of Norwich, Christmas Production and a Christmas Service. We also invite you to our monthly community lunches. There is one at noon on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> November.
