As part of LOHP's major three-year **Conservation & Learning** project and in conjunction with the **History Department of the University of East Anglia** the trust is holding a local history day on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> November.

The work of **LOHP**, the current history project and getting involved.

Following a break for lunch an **Archive Surgery** - to which local people are invited to bring along old photographs. Local experts will be present to give an opinion about related material and archives. A scanner will be available to capture any useful material.
