We welcomed all our friends from All Saints, Winfarthing, and local friends, plus Canon Hartley & Mr Mash of the Diocesan Board of Education to share in the dedication service for our new Partnership. After shared lunchtime, the children enjoyed activities together. In our own school we celebrated St Andrew's Day by raising the new school flag to welcome visitors to the site.
