## North and South Lopham Parish Councils

**Village Meetings (Friday 15th April)** - This year, for the first time, North Lopham Parish Council has agreed to hold its meeting immediately after that of South Lopham at the Village Hall. The South Lopham meeting will commence at 7.30pm and it's anticipated that the North Lopham meeting will start at 8pm (though this time is of course flexible). It is hoped that there will be a good attendance from both villages. Complimentary wine will be provided. After the conclusion of the North Lopham Meeting the **AnnualGeneralMeeting of The Lophams'Society** will be held. The Society now covers both villages and nominations for appointment to the Committee are encouraged, particularly from North Lopham. Prior notification to the Secretary, Paddy Miller (01379 687490), would be welcome but is not essential.

**Elections** - In May there will be an election for **Parish Councillors** for both parishes (and all others!). New blood is always welcome and indeed is highly desirable. ## North Lopham Parish Council

The **cemetery wall** repairs have been completed at a cost of £954, covered by the Bernice Malson legacy of £1000. The **Lophams' Links play area group** made a

request for funding to help cover the costs of their planning application. A sum of £250 from reserves was proposed and approved. Two of the three current planning applications, at Dairy Farm and Whitebread's Farm have been approved with conditions by Breckland, the third, at Meadow Farm, and a new application for a wind turbine at Grange Farm are under consideration. **The state of the local roads** is an ongoing cause for concern. Since the Barhale Area Manager inspected the road surface from Church Corner to Cherry Tree Close and Kenninghall Road pumping station, plus Tanns Lane, to see the 21 areas of concern left after the sewer installation, work has begun to make good the damage. Flooding continues at the chestnut tree bend on the road to South Lopham in spite of the drains being cleared. Primrose Lane/Jubilee Lane flooding persists. The burst water main in Tanns Lane required a road closure for repair. **Several acts of petty vandalism** have been reported, most probably committed by persons passing through the village. Walter Vernon has been re-elected to serve for a further four years as trustee of the **North Lopham Charity**. The next meeting is on March 9th at 7pm. Residents are very welcome to attend.
